WORSHIP

From Green to Gold — October 8, 2017

As a quick update on football news, my Packers won their game two Thursdays ago against the Chicago Bears. Green Bay continues to be plagued by injuries, but still was able to have a great game with our quarterback throwing four touchdown passes and converting three turnovers into scores. The Bears sure didn't seem to help themselves, to our benefit obviously. It was almost the opposite situation for the Redskins last Monday night. They faced the only undefeated team, the Kansas City Chiefs, and for the most part held their own. But they too didn't help themselves with some costly mistakes, such as their fumble in the final seconds of the game. They just didn't get it done. We don't want that said of our spiritual lives. We have to "get it done." God gives us all we need with His graces. We in turn have to avail ourselves to those graces and then cooperate with them to grow in holiness, to resist the temptations to sin, and to do what is right before God. That certainly applies to us personally, but also matters when it comes to such issues as the sanctity of life.

This month of October is dedicated by our bishops to a respect for all human life, especially that of the unborn, as they are the most vulnerable and do not yet have a voice to defend themselves. For that reason we are called upon to be their voice. Last Sunday was Respect Life Sunday. At different locations throughout our diocese and across the nation people gathered for an hour or more and simply stood (and prayed) for a greater respect for life. In addition we are currently in the midst of another 40 Days for Life. Our parish pro-life coordinator, Steve Grist, spoke at all Masses last weekend about life and the 40 Days program. I am grateful for Steve's efforts in this regard. Sadly, this battle has been ongoing for decades. If we can't respect the baby in the womb, it becomes a much easier transition to not respect the life of a person outside the womb. That in part is what allows such horrific events to occur such as late last Sunday night in Las Vegas. There, as we all probably are now aware of, a lone individual gunned down over 50 people and injured another 500 plus people. This is devastating and only one example of such total loss of the respect we should have for life. That is why we have this month. Hopefully we will use it well and pray fervently for a greater respect of all human life.

This month is also the Month of the Rosary, so perhaps that could be our form of prayer for life. By no means should it be limited to that very popular way of praying. Rosaries can be prayed for many other intentions as well, but what a beautiful way to invoke the intercession of Our Lady, whom we honor this Friday. That day is the 100th anniversary of the final appearance of Mary at Fatima, Portugal to three young children. I spoke about this topic here in this column five months ago when the Church opened the special observance of this apparition. As you may recall Mary asked that the Rosary be prayed daily for the conversion of souls and for peace. She also asked that sacrifices be made for poor sinners and that First Saturdays be observed for the reparation of sins. On that final day of her appearance those attending experienced the "miracle of the sun." Mary continues to intercede for us with her Son and promised that if we indeed did turn to prayer peace would come. And do we ever need peace in this world of ours! So we have to pray—the Rosary, at Holy Hours, during Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, in front of abortion facilities, at the diocesan pilgrimage to the Basilica in DC this Saturday, or really wherever we are and whenever we have a moment to do so.




