## WORSHIP

### *From Green to Gold – February 26, 2017*

We are just days away from the beginning of Lent. That is why we have started the Bishop's Lenten Appeal, that annual opportunity to contribute to the many activities and functions of the diocese. I spoke of this somewhat extensively here last week. In addition Fr. Isenberg and I mentioned the appeal in our homilies last weekend. This weekend is Commitment Sunday. I will walk you through the process of filling out the pledge envelope. I know this is rather tedious, and you probably have done it multiple times before and know the process. Nonetheless, as I also mentioned here last week, this system seems to bear fruit, so I ask for your patience and cooperation. Of course we are asking that you be as generous as possible to the appeal, knowing that God is never outdone in generosity. Our goal this year is \$212,000. No doubt we want to reach and even surpass that goal, if we can. More importantly, we would be thrilled if every family participated this year. You have been very generous in past years for which we are extremely grateful, and our participation level has been rather decent, although not ideal. So, again whatever you can do is appreciated!

The timing of the Bishop's appeal is intentional as one of the three practices of Lent is almsgiving. This involves giving of oneself. This is truly a sacrifice. We can give to many worthy charities. One such example is taking a tag from a nail in the Lenten Cross of Mercy which can be found in the vestibule and fulfilling the request on the tag. I should point out, however, that it is a precept of the Church to provide for one's parish and the Church at large, such as the diocese AND the universal Church. Thus making a contribution to the BLA fulfills this first aspect of Lent and that precept. The second practice of this penitential season is fasting. This is the idea of giving up something for the forty days of Lent. It obviously should be something that is also a sacrifice, meaning something we like. That could include all sweets, desserts, or alcohol. It might mean giving up meat, not just on Fridays and Ash Wednesday as is required, but all meat. The list is not limited to food and beverage items, but might be TV or searching the net. The third practice, and perhaps the most important one, is increased prayer. It is probably safe to say we all could pray more. Lent provides us a great chance to do that. This could include attending the Stations of the Cross on Friday evenings. We could also attend the meatless meals in the parish hall before the Stations. We may need to do more than just the weekly Stations. Anything we can add to our schedules without overburdening ourselves will help to make this Lent a more spiritually fruitful one. While *not* a Holy Day of Obligation, attending Mass on Ash Wednesday is a wonderful way to begin this holy season which prepares us for the celebration of Easter and for that moment when we will meet Our Eternal Judge.

Briefly, two other ways of adding prayer to the Lenten Season is to participate in the 40 Days for Life program by praying at an abortion facility or even stopping in our Adoration Chapel and offering an hour of prayer for the protection of human life, especially that of the unborn and those most vulnerable. A second opportunity for prayer is something that actually started in December. It's called Operation Storm Heaven and involves praying the Rosary on the first day of each month specifically for the spread of the Light of Truth and to dispel confusion, in which much of our world seems to be. One last thing this week, as part of our almsgiving, we could volunteer with any of our apostolates. One apostolate that is in need of a leader is our Grays of God, which serves the more mature (read: older) population of our parish. This position has been dormant for a while, which is why you haven't heard of any activities from this group. If anyone is interested please contact me. May we have a holy Lent. ~ In Christ, *Fr. ### Lent Begins This Wednesday

Wednesday, **March 1<sup>st</sup>** is Ash Wednesday. Masses, with the distribution of ashes, will be celebrated at: 6:30 am, 8:30 am (school in attendance), 12:15 pm, 5:00 pm, and 7:30 pm.

Please note that the 7:30 pm Ash Wednesday Mass takes the place of the regular Wednesday evening schedule—there will be no 6:30 pm Confessions or Holy Hour.

Ash Wednesday is a day of Fast and Abstinence: Everyone 14 years and older is bound to observe the law of abstinence from meat. (This applies during the Fridays of Lent as well.) Everyone from 18 years up to the beginning of the 60<sup>th</sup> year is also bound to observe the law of fast. On this day, only one full meatless meal is allowed. Two other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal.

### Holy Land Christians' Display



After all Masses on this weekend, **February 25<sup>th</sup> and 26<sup>th</sup>**, outside the north narthex and in the parish hall, there will be a display of beautiful handmade olive wood carvings from the Holy Land. These carvings, made by the Christians of Bethlehem, are a major source of income, with more than 80% of the community dependent on it. These brothers and sisters of ours are enduring hardships at this moment because of the volatile situation in their home country. The Christian population has dropped from almost 40% to less than 1% today. You can support them by purchasing some of these beautiful carvings after Mass. Keeping the Christian presence is vital for the protection of our holy sites, for keeping the faith alive, and for preserving the voice of peace in the world.


