### From Green to Gold — May 21, 2017

As I open this column this week I want to comment one more time about a topic I mentioned last week. As this column is always written about a week in advance neither of these events had occurred as I wrote about them. The two events were Confirmation and First Holy Communion. Our eighth graders were confirmed on May 10<sup>th</sup> by Bishop Higgins of the Military Archdiocese. Both the students and their parents seemed to be quite impressed by the bishop and his homily. It truly was a beautiful evening, one where the presence of the Holy Spirit was quite evident. Obviously, there were no tongues of flame or great winds sweeping through the church that night, but it really was a grace -filled evening. In regards to the First Communion, we had two Masses last Saturday. Once again, the wonderful innocence of our second graders along with their great faith and true belief in the Real Presence of Our Lord was very inspiring. It really is a great joy for a pastor (or any priest for that matter) to see these little ones receive Jesus in the Eucharist for the first time. Their devotion and love of God are so moving. It is one of the great pleasures and such a privilege of serving God. I congratulate all of these young people. I also want to express my gratitude to Fr. Isenberg and Deacon Ochenkowski who together oversee the religious education program here at St. Veronica's. In addition I am grateful to the children's teachers, aides, parents, godparents, sponsors, and anyone else who was instrumental in preparing them for these two sacraments. A week before our children in RCIC and RCIT made their first Communion and earlier this Saturday those in the Atrium program (a Montessori program) received their First Holy Communion. So, to all of them congratulations as well and a word of gratitude to all who worked with them!


We have so many dedicated and truly caring individuals who give of their time to work with these young people preparing them for the sacraments and handing on the Catholic Faith to them. Our CCD program ended for the year this past week. It concluded with the enrollment of our First Communicants in the Brown Scapular and with a May Crowning ceremony. As the weather was ideal, it took place outside at the statue of Mary in front of the church. This is always such a tremendous way to express our devotion to and our love for the Blessed Mother, particularly during "her month." Having our second graders with us, some of them in their First Communion garb, is a further blessing. The school had its May Crowning this past Friday, but, again, after this column was written. I will take this opportunity to thank all of our CCD teachers, aides, hall monitors, and other volunteers who gave so much of their time and effort this school year for the sake of our children and the glory of God. We couldn't have this program without their support. So, thank you!! Of course I appreciate all that our teachers, administration, and staff at the school do all year long as well. The school year has about another month to go vet. Actually the eighth graders finish their class work on June 2<sup>nd</sup> and graduate the evening of June 6th. The rest of the school finishes on June 14th. It has been a good school year, although it has had its challenges. We do hope to have a new principal in place in a week or two. Please pray that Our Lord guides us in this process.

As a reminder this Thursday is Ascension Thursday, however in our immediate area and across most of our nation it has been moved to next Sunday. If you are in Philadelphia, Newark, New York, Boston, or Hartford this week they still observe this Thursday as the Ascension and thus a Holy Day of Obligation. That is true in the state of Nebraska as well. Again, the rest of our country has (regretfully, in my opinion) moved it to next Sunday. The following Sunday, June 4<sup>th</sup>, is Pentecost and the end of the Easter season. Finally, we will have our annual Corpus Christi procession on that feast day, Sunday, June 18<sup>th</sup>, which is also Father's Day. Please plan on joining us, and pray for good weather.



13 Reasons Why - Some Thoughts for Parents of Teens: Over the past month, this Netflix series has gone viral, particularly among teens and young adults. It is very attractive to adolescents in part because of its accurate portrayal of some aspects of teen life. However, there are



many reasons to be concerned about the messages portrayed by this series. As a Youth Apostolate, we strongly discourage young teens from viewing this show. For older teens, we strongly recommend that parents view it before allowing them to see it. Parents should be aware that many mental health professionals and suicide prevention organizations believe that the show is potentially harmful for young people. The show includes confusing messages about suicide and other concerning content where serious and traumatic experiences in the lives of the characters are depicted in a raw and graphic manner. To learn more about the show and how to talk with teens about its serious content, we recommend a video by Catholic therapist, Roy Petitfils entitled 13 Reasons Why, The Good, The Bad, and The Ugly, which can be viewed on Youtube.
