WORSHIP

From Green to Gold — July 23, 2017

Last Sunday we enrolled approximately 25 people in the Brown Scapular. As was noted in previous bulletins, this past Sunday would have been the feast of Our Lady of Mt. Carmel. It was under this title that the Blessed Mother asked us to wear the scapular as a reminder of God's presence in our lives and that she would intercede for us. Enrollment in the scapular typically takes place in second grade after a child makes his or her First Holy Communion. Obviously some missed that for various reasons, thus the ceremony last Sunday after the 9:00 am Mass. This Sunday at all Masses we have Fr. Posey with us. It works out well, as Fr. Isenberg is away with our Rangers Scout troop in Canada, where they are on a camping trip. Fr. Posey is pastor of St. James Parish in Falls Church and is director of the diocesan Missions Office. He also served for a number of years in the diocesan mission parish in Banica, Dominican Republic. He is conducting the annual mission appeal here, and this year it is for Banica. I thank him for his help this weekend and ask that you be as generous as you can be to this worthy appeal. I do also want to remind you that a few weeks ago I mentioned that we were collecting gift cards for the poor. We were specifically looking for ones from Walmart, as that store has all the items that most of the poor that come to us need. Again, if you are so moved to help in this way, please drop the cards off at the parish office. You could place them in the collection basket on Sundays, if that is more convenient. Thank you, as always, for all of your tremendous generosity.

Moving on briefly to a much more mundane topic but also in line with the title of this column, this coming Thursday, July 27th, is the opening of the Green Bay Packers Training Camp. I often try to get home to visit my family about this time of the summer. In addition my Dad's birthday is right around that same time (the day before this year). Actually Fr. Isenberg returns on Wednesday, and I will head home to God's country next week. I'm a week or so delayed as a nephew of mine is getting married on August 5th. My point is that it is getting to be that time again to start talking about my favorite NFL team. No doubt I am hoping for a great year. As with all things and especially football, time will tell. I think the right pieces are in place. Are the Packers the best team this year? Probably not, but there are so many other factors that determine how things will turn out, so I'm hoping for the best, as we should with all things.

This week also brings us another somewhat significant date. Tuesday, the 25th, is the 49th anniversary of the promulgation of the landmark papal encyclical, Humanae Vitae. This document was written by Blessed Pope Paul VI after the close of Vatican II in response to the moral question of the use of birth control or contraception. (I may speak about this next Sunday in my homily.) The issue was controversial then and sadly continues to be today. That is true because people, including many Catholics, either don't understand or don't want to accept the Church's teaching on this subject. Most other Christian Faiths have no problem with this, but that was not always the case. In fact prior to 1930 every Christian church taught that the use of contraception was wrong. As the tide was turning, Pope Pius XI issued an encyclical on the topic. People continued to challenge the Church's teaching, so 35 years later Vatican II tried to address it, but it was decided that it was such a "hot topic" that it would be tabled and studied separately. A commission was established by the pope to do just that. It was made up of theologians, medical people, and lay faithful. The result was mixed, but the majority recommended to the pope that the Church change its teaching. This result had leaked out and so many anticipated a change. After reviewing the commission's report however, Paul VI replied that he could not change Church teaching and issued a truly beautiful response, his encyclical, *Humanae Vitae*, on July 25, 1968. Modest Attire

Now that summer is half over, perhaps it is a good time to reflect on how we dress in the presence of the Lord, whether attending Mass or other sacred ceremonies.

Upon entering the Church, we enter the house of God and come into the Real Presence of Our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament. Of course, our interior disposition of reverence is most important. Reverence, however, is also to be expressed outwardly—in the modesty and reverence of our dress and actions, which should be a sign of respect for Our Lord and others in His Presence and not a way of drawing attention to ourselves.

Some specific guidelines come to mind: We should <u>not</u> wear shorts, halter-tops, low-cut shirts, flip-flops, mini-skirts, tight-fitting clothing, or clothing that exposes the back or midriff. While some of these items may be appropriate for picnics or other outdoor activities, they certainly are not appropriate for Church. Through our modest attire and good example as we worship in His Presence, we give due honor and glory to God by showing our reverential love for Him and our respect for our fellow parishioners. Thank you for trying to adhere to these guidelines, and may Our Lord bless you always.
