# From Green to Gold — July 30, 2017

Last week here I briefly spoke about the Packers, who this past Thursday opened their training camp, indicating that football season is just around the corner. I further mentioned that I am hoping for a great year. What began on Thursday will have an impact on the rest of the season and could determine how well the team will do as the season progresses. We do something similar with our spiritual lives. Every day, not just a few weeks each year, we are preparing for heaven. That is why it is important to pray daily, to go to Mass at least every Sunday (or Saturday evening), to avail ourselves regularly to the sacrament of confession, and to do works of mercy (or charity). That is why we also need to have an awareness of the teachings of our Catholic Faith. For a child this could mean attending a Catholic school or a CCD program, or for an adult it means attending an adult education class or reading a good Catholic book, including and especially the <u>Catechism of the Catholic Church</u>.

Last week here I also began discussing a particular teaching of our Church which is either misunderstood or outright rejected by many. The topic was contraception. I raised it because last Tuesday, July 25th, was the 49<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the release of the papal encyclical, *Humanae Vitae*. This is the Church document, written by Blessed Pope Paul VI, which maintained the consistent teaching that the use of artificial birth control or contraception is immoral, in fact seriously sinful. While nearly all other Christian faiths have succumbed to the way of the times, the Catholic Church has not. Sadly, it is often criticized for that, but Paul VI knew what he was talking about. His document no doubt addresses the sinfulness of the use of birth control, but primarily it is a beautiful explanation of marriage. It is an description of how marriage is between a man and woman who give their love and lives to each other. As such marriage is about sacrifice and selflessness. It is love-giving and life-giving. These two aspects then cannot be separated, and if they are it is to the detriment of the marriage and even society. The Holy Father predicted that if the contraceptive mentality became prevalent four things would happen. There would be a general societal lowering of moral standards. There would be a rise in infidelity between husbands and wives. There would be a lessening of respect for women by men. And fourthly, government entities would assume the authority to intervene in the personal and intimate responsibilities of husbands and wives. All four of these predictions have come to fruition over the past half century.

The pope of happy memory implored us to be faithful to the sanctity of marriage, which again is both unitive and procreative or generative. The great gift of marriage is not limited to the love shared by husband and wife, but includes the fruit of that love, the gift of children! A couple literally cooperates in the creating power of God, Who provides the marital act as something integral to a marriage. He created it to be pleasurable as a means for the husband and wife to express their love for each other and as a reward to the married couple who have the not always easy task of raising children. Couples are not to see each other an object of their desires, but as two who have become one by the grace of God. Thus, again these two aspects of marriage are always to be present. A married couple nonetheless may need to at times limit the size of their family. The pope provides four reasons for this in his encyclical, which I will discuss here next week. In the meantime we pray for all married couples and those considering marriage. We also pray for our society, which has in many ways become what Pope Paul feared. ~ In Christ, Fr. Kleinmann
