From Green to Gold — August 13, 2017

I can't report on my trip home to Wisconsin as this column was actually written before I departed for my week with my family. I mentioned twice previously that I wasn't able to get to Green Bay this year due to a family wedding. One of the things that the Packers do during training camp is daily after meeting in the locker room of the stadium, the players head over to the practice facility, which is just across the street from Lambeau Field. Fans of all ages line up to greet the players as they make their way to practice. The younger fans often bring their bikes with the hope that one of the Packers will choose their bike to ride over to the facility. The child then gets to ride with the player or stroll alongside the Packer, all the while talking to him. It's a custom that began in 1957. As one commentator recently said it creates quite a spectacle—"adoring youngsters and oversized men on tiny wheels." It was noted that the Packer fans and the players have a unique relationship. "The fans and team march to a much different beat than the rest" of the NFL, as "there is an intimate connection between the Pack and the Cheeseheads." As was also observed, all of this makes the Packers "clearly the most charming" of all NFL teams.

The above might be a bit much, but no doubt in my opinion there is indeed something special about the Packers. For one they are the only publically owned team in all of professional sports and their home is in the smallest city of any professional sports team. Green Bay's population is just over 105,000 people. Their stadium seats 81,435, meaning over four-fifths of the city could fit into Lambeau! That is probably more detail than is necessary, but it helps to make my point. We should have a similar relationship with Jesus Christ. There should be something special there, an intimate connection to the Son of God. Obviously, our encounter with Christ is much more important than our encounter with our favorite NFL team, be that the Packers, the Redskins, or any other team. But that bond between the Packers and their fans could help us to understand how close of a connection we should have to Our Lord.

It could also be similar to the bond that exists between a shepherd and his sheep. This is in part why Jesus uses that image. A shepherd cares deeply for his sheep, and for that reason he also leads them. He walks in front of them, and they follow. That is the very image of a priest and his congregation when he offers Mass "ad orientem," as it is referred to. Some refer to it as the priest turning his back on the people. That is not true however, for he is simply leading his people in prayer. Rather than praying at his people, he is praying with his people. "Ad orientem" means "to the east." That was the customary way of offering Mass as well, facing east. The reason behind this is that the sun rises in the east, and we often refer to Jesus as the "Rising Sun," which connects us to His resurrection. Thus, saying Mass "ad orientem" in some way could connect us closer to Christ. We currently say the 10:45 am Mass each Sunday in this manner. Some parishes now offer all their Masses this way, and we have received some requests to offer more Masses "ad orientem." For that reason starting in September on the First Saturday only of each month we will offer the 8:30 am Mass "ad orientem."

One final item, for about the past year a parishioner, Sally Dillon, has been volunteering to arrange flowers for the sanctuary. The Church prefers that we have fresh flowers adorning the "holy of holies." Sally has seen to that, but due to a number of family matters, she has now stepped down from this position as our floral director. I am grateful to her for all the hours she spent purchasing flowers, arranging them, watering them, etc. She has done a beautiful job for which I thank her. May God bless her and her family. ~ In Christ, *Fr. Kleinmann*




