From Green to Gold — December 10, 2017

I begin today with comments about my Green Bay Packers. They were the favorites last week despite some of their rather dismal play these past few weeks after their starting quarterback, Aaron Rodgers, went down with a broken collarbone. The Tampa Bay Buccaneers have not had a great season, so this seemed like a probable win for the Packers. They did indeed win, 26 to 20, but it took an overtime touchdown to accomplish that, indicating that Tampa Bay gave Green Bay a bit of a run for their money, as they say. The Packers had almost no passing game, gaining only 84 yards, the fewest since mid-season 1994. It shouldn't have been this hard, but the win did keep their playoff hopes alive. Today they face off against the Cleveland Browns, who have yet to win a game this year. My hope is that streak continues and that the Packers have a relatively easy win. Aaron is eligible to play the following week, and if he is fully recovered and the team is still a contending one, he should be back.

The message above fits in well with this Advent season in which we currently find ourselves. This season of the Church year is meant to be a time of joyful expectation and preparation. A football season is always a joyous time. To be honest with you when I heard that Aaron Rodgers got injured, I was not filled with joy. But even with that, there is something exciting about football. On any given Sunday anything can happen—an injury, a horrible loss, an amazing win. So it is with our spiritual lives. We go about our daily routine—work, family, home duties, and most especially God. Through the year this can become a bit monotonous. The Church in her wisdom shakes that up with seasons like Advent and Lent or Christmas and Easter. The first two seasons are penitential ones, which are intended to make us focus more or refocus, if necessary, on what is most important. That would be our relationship with Jesus Christ and our impending salvation. Just as a football team has to work together if they hope to win games, we too foremost need to work with Our Lord, but also with one another. We have to shake off any complacency. We have to work at becoming more and more holy. Advent then is a great opportunity to think about where we are with God and where we need to be so that salvation indeed will be ours someday. As I mentioned last week here, we can become caught up in all the festivities of this pre-Christmas season, but it is Advent and not yet Christmas, which begins the evening of December 24th and continues officially this year through January 8th. You may recall that traditionally the Christmas season extends to February 2nd.

This year is somewhat interesting. We had the longest possible Advent last year with four full weeks. This year we have the shortest possible with three weeks, for the Fourth Sunday of Advent is Christmas Eve Day (the 24th). Some may be tempted to try for a "two-for." That means since Christmas Eve Day is a Sunday, some may think they can go to Mass at 4:00 pm on Sunday and fulfill both their Sunday and Christmas obligations. That however is NOT true; there is no "two-for." One can fulfill the Sunday obligation by attending Mass Saturday evening (5:00 pm here at St. Veronica's) or on Sunday morning (7:30, 9:00 or 10:45 am here). We will not have our usual Sunday evening 5:00 Mass. We will have a 4:00 and 6:00 pm Christmas Eve Mass and then Midnight and 9:00 and 11:00 am on Christmas Day (Monday, the 25th). One can attend any of the Christmas Masses for the Christmas obligation. In addition one could attend either the 4:00 or 6:00 pm Christmas Eve Masses and count that towards the Sunday obligation and then ALSO attend the Midnight, 9:00, or 11:00 am Christmas Day Masses for the Christmas obligation. I hope that is clear; if not please see one of us clergy. God Bless!


