WORSHIP

FROM GREEN TO GOLD—MARCH 1, 2020

Now that we are officially entering the month of March and have begun the penitential season of Lent our focus is on growing in holiness through the typical practices of the season, prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. I addressed all of these in last week's column. It is always good to try to do something in each of these categories. We don't want to overwhelm ourselves, but we also want our selections to be at least somewhat challenging. After all the point is to practice self-denial and really make some spiritual progress. The hope is whatever we choose to do this Lent will really help us to deepen our love for Christ and our neighbor, to again increase our holiness and the practice of the virtues, and to better prepare ourselves for heaven someday. Lent, while intensely penitential, is such a beautiful time of the year. The simplicity and starkness of the Lenten season are so different from Advent with all its hype that the pre-Christmas season seems to bring. Hopefully then we can make the most of this Lent and keep it what it is meant to be. The sacrifices of this season in a sense are truly quite refreshing, particularly when we consider where our world has gone and what our society today seems to preach to us. Lent then is so counter cultural, where we do not seek personal pleasure and instant gratification but rather to suffer with Christ.

As I also mentioned here last week our parish is offering additional times for confession, which is a big part of this Lenten season. Clearing our souls of sin and the extra grace that this sacrament of mercy provides further helps us to grow spiritually. We have the additional half hour of confessions on Wednesday and the hour on Friday evenings. There is also the meatless meals at 6:00 pm and the Stations of the Cross at 7:00 pm on Fridays. Beyond that we have typically tried to have a three part speaker series each Lent on a selected topic. This year as I mentioned last week our topic is the Scrutinies. Liturgically, the scrutinies are rites celebrated on the third, fourth, and fifth Sundays of Lent. They involve those who are enrolled in the RCIA classes and are thinking about becoming Catholic. They are meant to be an opportunity for the parish at large to "scrutinize" or look at our new potential Catholics and see who they are that we might pray for them as they make their final decision whether God is calling them to become Catholic or not. Another reason for the scrutinies is that they are meant to be an opportunity for those involved to purify their hearts, strengthen themselves when tempted, firm up their decision making process, and more closely unite themselves to Christ Himself. The Gospels those weeks include the woman at the well, the blind man from birth, and the raising of Lazarus from the dead.

Among other themes these scrutinies remind us that with Christ our faith is strengthened, our spiritual blindness healed, and death has no real power over us. Also we are called upon to hear and believe, to see and believe, and to even believe with no proof. We further realize Jesus is the Living Water who cleanses us of our sins, the Light of the World Who enlightens our souls, and the Resurrection and the Life Who saves us. That then will be the topic of this year's Lenten Reflection. This is being held on Wednesday nights after the 7:30 pm Mass on March 11th, 18th, and 25th. Fr. Dyer, Deacon Ochenkowski, and I are the presenters. We each are taking one of the nights. Hopefully, you will be able to join us as we explore this topic each of those nights. Our hope also is that this will be one more way to make this Lent a truly holy and more spiritually fruitful time. ~ *In Christ, Fr. Kleinmann*


