As we celebrate the resurrection of Our Lord and continue through these troubled, coronavirus-focused days, as indicated here, I want to wish all of you a most blessed and glorious Easter! Sadly, these continue to be very strange times, by no means, ideal ones. It is so frustrating that we can't be together at Mass celebrating Jesus' rising from the dead. I appreciate that many of you have watched our parish YouTube channel where we have live-streamed or have recorded Masses and also the Good Friday Liturgy and Stations of the Cross. I do have to remind you that these are NOT the same as actually being at Mass. There does seem to be some confusion about that for some. Our modern technology is wonderful in many ways, but it does not replace that in-person contact. That is for the most part why I don't use e-mail. Admittedly, in recent years I have succumbed to using text messaging, but that too loses that personal contact. So I pray for the day we can gather together again as a parish family. I have heard that all of this "craziness" has actually helped some families re-connect with each other as we for the most part have been forced to slow down, stay home and really spend more time with our families. Additionally, people have continued to commendably take advantage of Eucharistic Adoration. Of course, as it must do every year during the Triduum, that had to end Holy Thursday evening, but it reopens here Easter Sunday afternoon. In that regard we do need more adorers, so please check out the schedule and consider spending this time with Our Lord, particularly since Mass still isn't available, and we don't know when it will be.

I truly hope everyone has a grace-filled Easter season. Again, we can't celebrate it as I would hope, but we know Christ has risen and is with us. We will continue having round the clock adoration, except for an occasional wedding, funeral, or baptism. We also still have our usual confession times. Please try to thank God for His presence among us, by praying more, reading the Bible or a good spiritual book, stopping in church, or to the extent possible helping those in need. We must pray for those suffering from COVID-19, for those who have died from this or any other illness, for their families, and for those heroic nurses, doctors, etc. who have cared for those inflicted with this virus. We also need to pray for the many who have been affected economically or emotionally - those who have lost their jobs or feel isolated and depressed, etc. May we invoke those saints who are patrons of pandemics, such as Our Lady of Monte Berico, St. Corona, St. Roch, and others to be mentioned in future columns.

Before concluding this week, I want to thank all of you who have visited the church, come to confession, helped prepare the church for our Triduum and Easter liturgies, and have been so kind to us priests and now seminarians. Yes, we have two seminarians living with us as their seminaries have closed due to the virus situation. Mike Nugent and Alfredo Tuesta will be here for two months. #### STAY IN TOUCH WITH YOUR FAITH

Summary of Readings for Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord First Reading: Acts 10:34a, 37-43

In this passage, Peter testifies that he and his followers saw the miracles performed by Christ, witnessed His death, and believe in His resurrection. Now they will proclaim to all that Christ is the Son of God.

#### Second Reading: Colossians 3:1-4

Paul tells the Colossians that they will appear with Christ in glory. They should be mindful of things above rather than things on earth.

#### Gospel: John 20:1-9

In vivid detail, John tells us that when Mary Magdalene visited Christ's tomb, the tomb was empty. She told the apostles, who ran to the tomb, and saw the "wrappings" on the ground. The disciple who entered first "saw and believed."



Each day, write down your experiences of being loved and your works of mercy on thin strips of paper, attach them together using staples, tape, or glue to make a chain.
